Dear Secretary Foxx:

On behalf of the Jacksonville Regional Chamber of Commerce, I am pleased to support the U.S. Department of Transportation's Fostering Advancements in shipping and Transportation for the Long-term Achievement of National Efficiencies (FASTLANE) grant, the Northeast Florida Freight Rail Program, submitted by the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) and the Jacksonville Transportation Authority (JTA). This project represents job growth, opportunity and increased freight capacity to accommodate current and future projected growth for the Jacksonville Port and all the ports along the east coast of Florida.

The Northeast Florida Freight Rail Program project expands and upgrades the transportation network for the movement of freight. The project works to alleviate a single point of congestion for freight movement throughout the southeastern United States; thus allowing for increased productivity and modern controls to help safety. This project helps the flow of freight today and prepares northeast Florida for the post Panamax expansion of port activity. It also prepares the infrastructure for the future North Rail Corridor Project.

Upgrading the transportation infrastructure at this location is critical to our business community because it will increase the fluidity of train movement through this critical juncture of four significant rail operations. An additional broader community benefit is routine delays that occur at this location result because traffic delays on the Southside of the St. Johns River, blocking access to a major medical facility and thriving business area.

The Northeast Florida Freight Rail Program project, by working collaboratively with the City of Jacksonville, Florida Department of Transportation, Freight Rail, and public and private businesses, will improve the transportation system not just for Jacksonville but for the entire southeastern United States. Again, I am in full support of this project.
