# Hurricane Evacuation Guide



What you need to know in the case of an evacuation



The Jacksonville Transportation Authority (JTA) is committed to helping our customers with special needs prepare for a hurricane. This guide has been prepared to help you understand what JTA services are available in the event of a city-ordered evacuation due to a hurricane emergency. Understanding the services that are available during an evacuation order will help you PLAN NOW for the best option for your needs.

# **Key Points to Know**

- Evacuate early. Make plans ahead of time. If possible, stay with friends or family members in a safe location. Public shelters are available as a last resort for any resident.
- Please be patient. Transport and transfer during a hurricane evacuation may take several hours.
- If available, private vehicles with family and friends are always the quickest and easiest alternative for evacuating.
- In an emergency, customers using JTA public transportation cannot choose their shelter destination.

### **Public Shelters**

During an evacuation order, public shelters will be announced and opened by the City of Jacksonville Emergency Operations Center (EOC).

## If You Have Special Needs

When an evacuation order is issued, the JTA will provide transportation for residents with special needs to a designated shelter.

Pre-registration with the city is required every year for special needs evacuation.

Registration **DOES NOT** carry over from year to year.

# **How to Register**

Please call the City of Jacksonville Division of Emergency Preparedness at **(904) 630-3758**.

Once registered, the JTA can transport customers to designated special needs public shelters.

**Note:** The JTA must discontinue all regular and evacuation services at an announced cut-off time (determined by city emergency officials) to ensure residents and employees are in a safe location before hurricane effects are expected. This includes all modes of transportation.

## In Summary

Please remember, it is **BEST** to make plans ahead of time and stay with friends or family members outside of the evacuation zone.

Public shelters are available as a last resort for any residents.

During an evacuation order, public shelters will be announced and opened by the City of Jacksonville Emergency Operations Center (FOC).
