Project Overview

- Project Limits: Red Cypress Drive to Walter Jones Historical Park
- Total Length: Approximately 2.3 miles
- Construct 5' wide sidewalk
 - East Side of Road from Red Cypress Drive to Rebecca's Cove Court
 - West Side of Road from Rebecca's Cove Court to Walter Jones Historical Park





Project Status

- Initial Environmental Review Complete
 - Completed in accordance with National Environmental Policy Act requirements
 - No adverse effects identified on cultural and historic resources
 - Florida Department of State concurrence received
 - Documented Categorical Exclusion (DCE) Concurrence Received from FTA
 - Pursuant to 23 CFR 771.118(d)
- Additional Environmental Review May be Required if Project Scope Changes



Project Status

- Topographical Survey Completed within Right-of-Way
- Preliminary Design Began in XXXX XXXX
- 30% Design Plans including:
 - Preliminary Sidewalk Layout
 - Potential Swale Regrading and Proposed Drainage Pipes
 - Potential Impacts to Trees, Utilities, and Existing Features




Design Considerations


- Public safety
- Improve mobility and accessibility
- Enhance connectivity from previously constructed segments
- Avoid right-of-way acquisition
- Preserve tree canopy
 - Minimize impacts to existing trees
- Minimize impacts to existing utilities
 - Water
 - Storm/Sanitary Sewer
 - Electric lines and poles
 - Fiber Optic
 - Telecommunications
- Minimize impacts to landscaping, fences, and mailboxes

Typical Sidewalk Cross Section






- Planned Steps to Preserve Existing Trees
 - Sidewalk layout placed to minimize impacts to trees
 - Extent of tree impacts will be finalized in final design
 - Sidewalk will be routed to avoid tree impacts to the maximum extent possible
 - Arborist review to be included in final design and during construction as needed
 - Tree protection and alternative sidewalk materials to protect trees and root system
 - Tree mitigation and protection will be in accordance with the City of Jacksonville ordinances and 10 set permitting review



- Potential Impacts within the City owned Right-of-Way
 - Potential Relocation
 - Utilities
 - Mailboxes
 - Landscaping
 - Fences
 - Drainage Swales
 - Replaced with inlets and pipes for sidewalk to remain in the right-of-way
 - Will not impact existing drainage





Next Steps

 Notification will be given to individual property owners with affected items within Right of Way

 Property Owners will be given the opportunity to remove or relocate any affected items in advance of construction

 Impacted items that are not relocated in advance may have to be demolished by the contractor during construction
