7 A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
8 JACKSONVILLE, FLORIDA, REQUESTING THE FLORIDA
9 DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (FDOT) SUPPORT THE
10 JACKSONVILLE TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY'S (JTA)
11 ABILITY TO MODIFY THE LIGHT DISPLAY ON THE ST.
12 ELMO W. ACOSTA BRIDGE (ACOSTA BRIDGE), AS
13 IDENTIFIED HEREIN.

15 **WHEREAS,** the St. Elmo W. Acosta Bridge, known as the Acosta
16 Bridge, is a 1,645-foot bridge that spans the St. Johns River,
17 connecting Downtown Jacksonville's Southbank and Northbank along
18 State Road 13; and

19 **WHEREAS,** in 2018, the JTA's Board of Directors approved a capital
20 investment to repair and update the Acosta Bridge lighting system
21 from the original neon tube fixture to a new dynamic LED system,
22 allowing for special lighting displays, as identified in **Exhibit 1**;
23 and

24 **WHEREAS,** since June of 2020 the JTA has operated and maintained
25 the Acosta Bridge lighting system on behalf of the City of
26 Jacksonville and its citizens; and

27 **WHEREAS,** by resolution adopted at a legally convened meeting on
28 August 26, 2022, a copy of which is attached hereto as **Exhibit 2** and
29 incorporated herein by this reference, the JTA Board of Directors
30 authorized JTA to request that the City of Jacksonville issue a
31 resolution in support of JTA's request that the Florida Department

1 of Transportation (FDOT) support JTA's ability to modify the light
2 display on the Acosta Bridge; and

3 **WHEREAS**, FDOT'S Bridge Lighting Policy, a copy of which is
4 attached hereto as **Exhibit 3** and incorporated herein by this
5 reference, requires that lighting systems capable of special lighting
6 schemes located on state or federal roadways that are operated and
7 maintained by local jurisdictions be approved by county or local
8 governments by way of resolution; and

9 **WHEREAS**, future amendments to the special lighting displays list
10 attached hereto as **Exhibit 1** may be presented to the City Council by
11 the JTA Board of Directors as a resolution to amend the list; and

12 **WHEREAS**, the City of Jacksonville recognizes the Acosta Bridge
13 lighting system as a local community asset for the purpose of
14 recognizing, commemorating, and promoting federal and state holidays
15 and local or other events of interest; now therefore

16 **BE IT RESOLVED** by the City Council of Jacksonville, Florida:

17 **Section 1. Support for JTA Request.** The City of
18 Jacksonville supports the lighting of the Acosta Bridge lighting
19 system as identified in **Exhibit 1**.

20 **Section 2. Certified Copy to FDOT.** A certified copy of
21 this Resolution will be forwarded to the State of Florida Department
22 of Transportation.

23 **Section 3. Effective Date.** This Resolution shall become
24 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective
25 without the Mayor's signature.

RESOLUTION

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE JACKSONVILLE TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY TO REQUEST THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE, FLORIDA TO ISSUE A RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF THE JTA'S REQUEST THAT THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SUPPORT THE JTA'S ABILITY TO MODIFY THE LIGHT DISPLAY ON THE ST. ELMO W. ACOSTA BRIDGE AS IDENTIFIED HEREIN.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 349, Florida Statutes, the Jacksonville Transportation Authority (JTA) is an agency of the state and an independent special district which plans, designs and constructs roads, bridges and appurtenances as well as operates multimodal public transportation services and acquires, develops and maintains transit-oriented development nodes for the benefit of the Northeast Florida community, and

WHEREAS, the St. Elmo W. Acosta Bridge, known as the Acosta Bridge, is a 1,645-foot bridge that spans the St. Johns River, connecting Downtown Jacksonville's Southbank and Northbank along State Road 13; and

WHEREAS, in 2018, the JTA's Board of Directors approved a capital investment to repair and update the Acosta Bridge lighting system from the original neon tube fixture to a new dynamic LED system, allowing for special lighting displays; and

WHEREAS, since June of 2020, the JTA has operated and maintained the Acosta Bridge lighting system, through a permit with the State of Florida Department of Transportation, on behalf of the City of Jacksonville and its citizens; and

WHEREAS, FDOT requires that lighting systems capable of special lighting schemes, located on state or federal roadways that are operated and maintained by the local jurisdictions, be approved by county or local governments by way of resolution; and

WHEREAS, the City of Jacksonville recognizes the Acosta Bridge lighting system as a local community asset for the purpose of recognizing, commemorating, and promoting federal and state holidays and local or other events of interest.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Directors of the Jacksonville Transportation Authority, Jacksonville, Florida:

Section 1. The JTA shall transmit this resolution to City of Jacksonville seeking its support of the JTA's lighting of the Acosta Bridge lighting system as identified in Exhibit A, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein.

Section 2. A certified copy of this Resolution and the City of Jacksonville's Resolution will be forwarded to the State of Florida Department of Transportation.





BRIDGE LIGHTING

Lighting a bridge is a great way to turn a bridge asset into an object that can brighten the everyday lives of residents and visitors. Towards this end, it is the policy of the department to display special lighting sequences on bridges with the capability.

Lighting colors and sequences shall be limited to preprogrammed themes developed with the lighting system plans during project development. New themes will be limited to the recognition, commemoration, and or promotion of federal or state holidays or celebrations. The lighting display will be decided by the department.

On bridges located on the state or federal system with lighting systems capable of special lighting displays, maintained and operated by a county or local government, special requests for lighting colors and sequences shall be limited to the recognition, commemoration, or promotion of federal or state holidays or celebrations, and events of broad community interest and significance approved by county or local governments. Requests meeting these parameters will be considered and will be on a first come basis. The department reserves the right to refuse any request it deems offensive or not in the best public interest.




